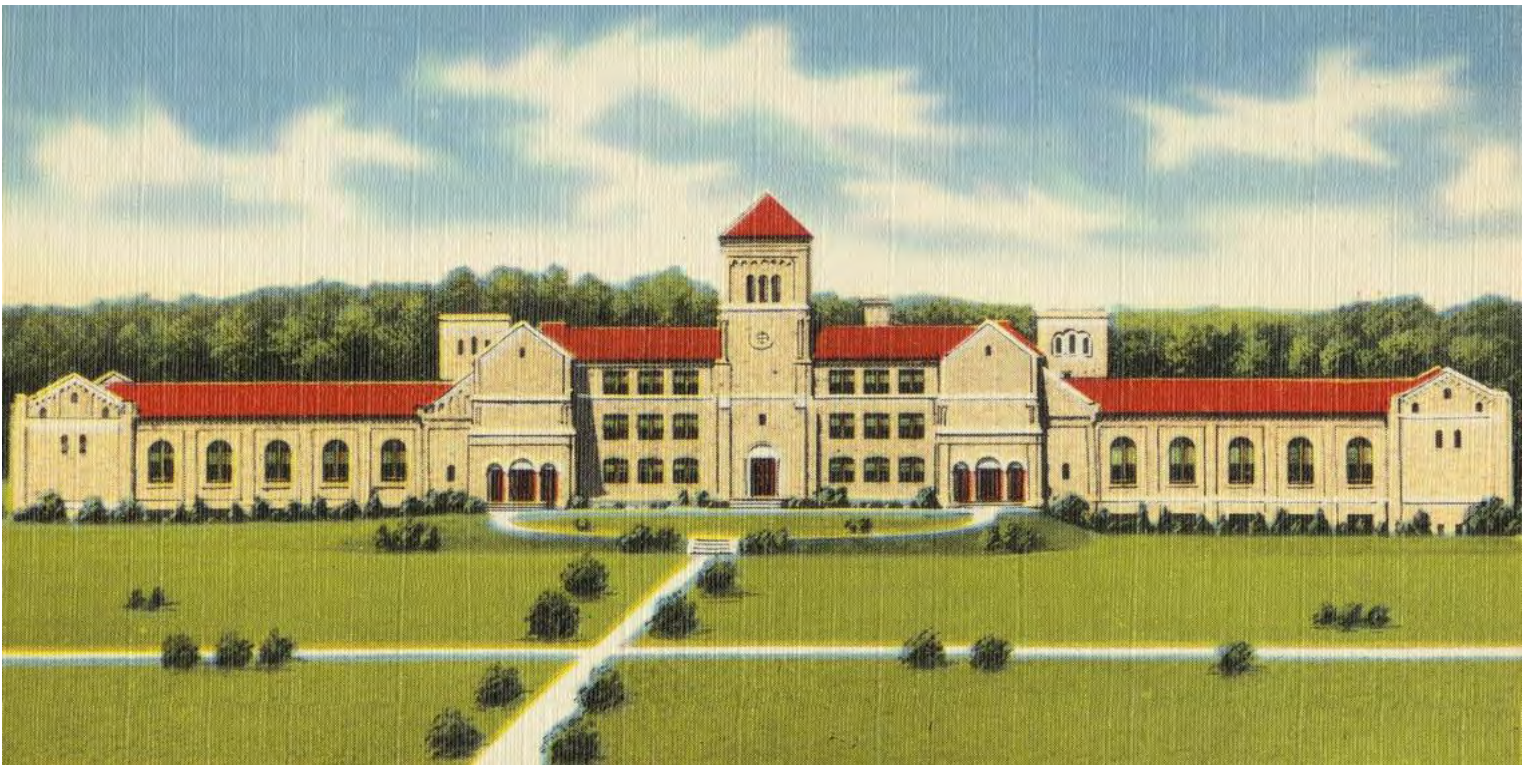

RESULTS

Executive Summary:

These first five pages provide a quick précis of the final results of the NBHS/JSBS 50-Year Reunion Survey, conducted in August 2019.

The informational survey was made available to all 1969 Broughton and Sanderson graduates who registered themselves as members of the Broughton High School Class of 1969 website. (Site address: www.broughton1969.com) There are currently 293 registered site members from both Broughton and Sanderson High Schools. All site members were strongly encouraged to fill out the 18-item survey.

Because survey participants self-selected, there is *no claim* that this is in any way a scientific study, nor that the results replicate the population of the '69 NBHS/JSBS graduating classes. The results reported here reflect only the reality of those who self-selected to take the survey.

After this Executive Summary is the complete, detailed report of the results of the survey, in which will be found more "drill-down" statistics, as well as results of inferential analysis. Page numbers for the corresponding detailed sections are given.

115 surveys were submitted.

38% of the Broughton+Sanderson site membership submitted surveys.

85 74% surveys from Broughton alums

26 23% surveys from Sanderson alums

4 3% surveys from grads of "other/private" schools

Significantly more Broughton alums submitted surveys than Sanderson alums, based on class size. (p=.005)

74 64% females submitted surveys

41 36% males submitted surveys

Significantly more females than males submitted surveys. (p=.002)

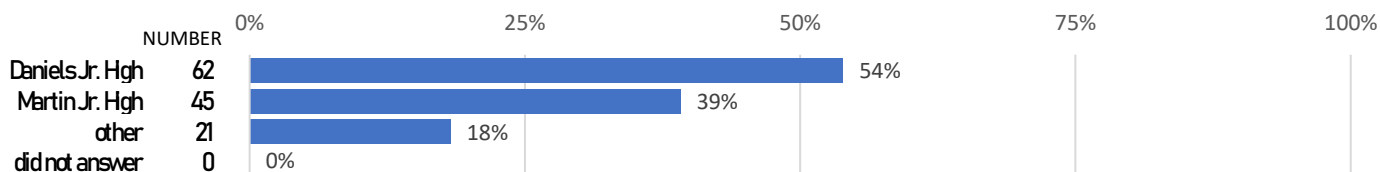

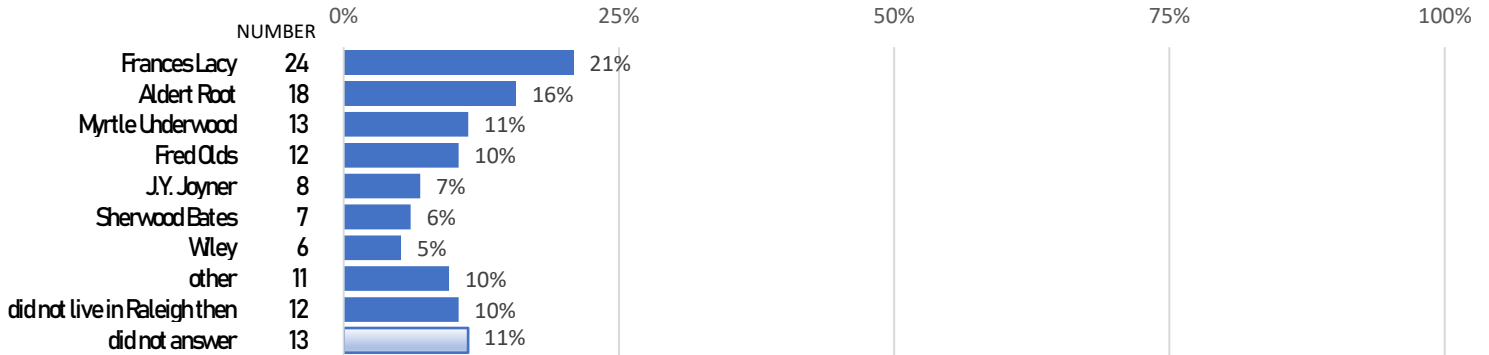

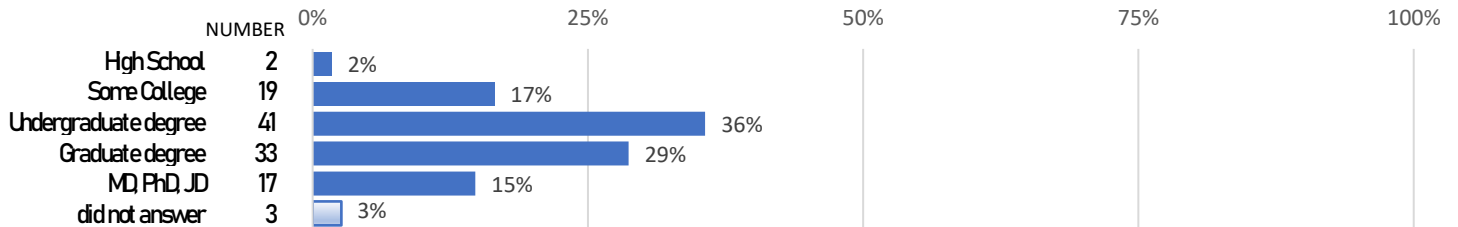

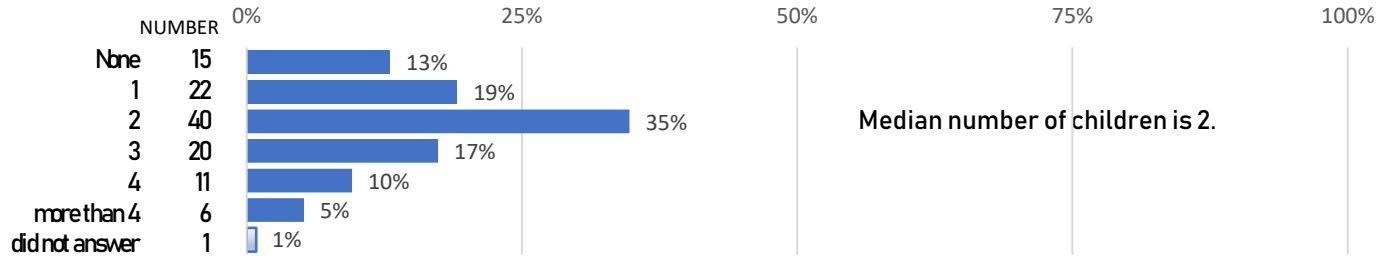

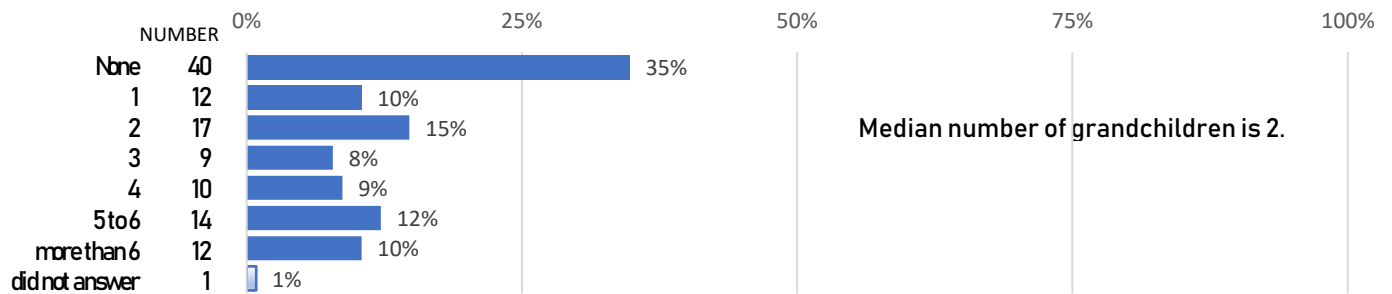

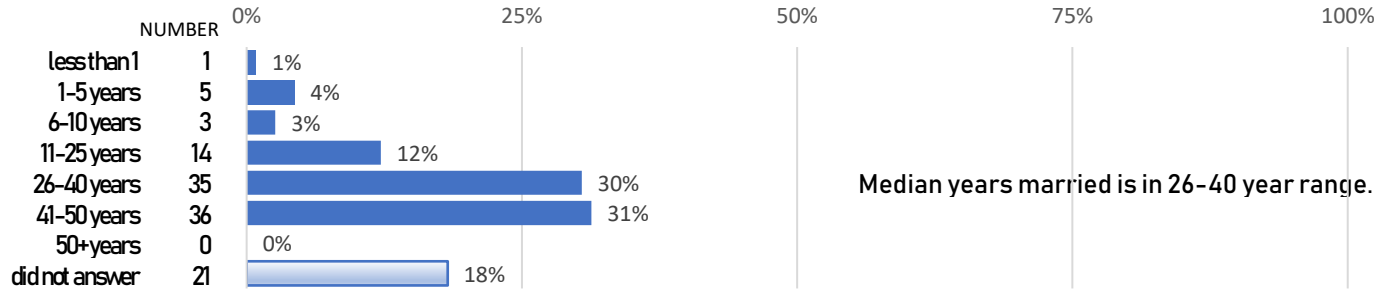

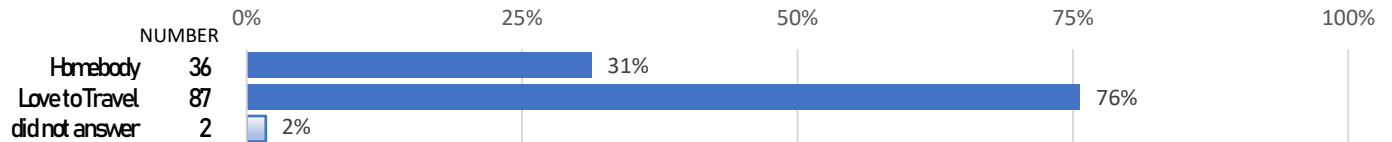

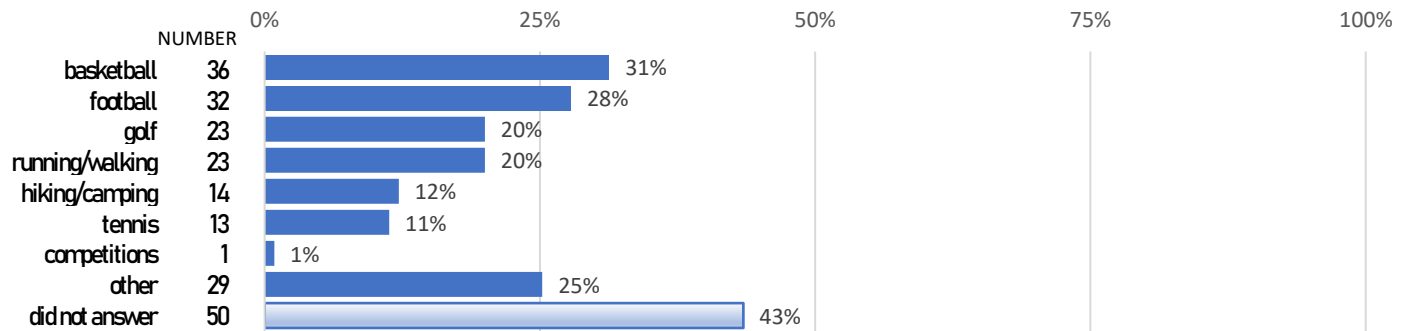

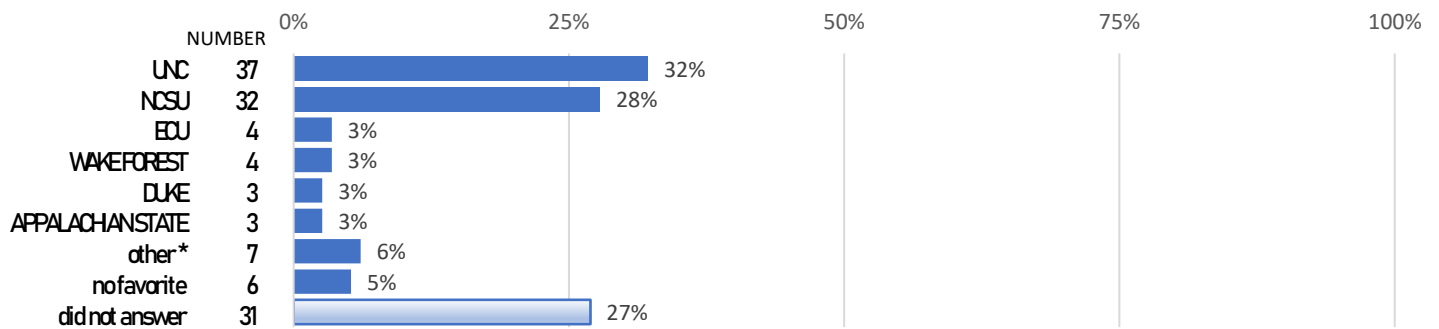

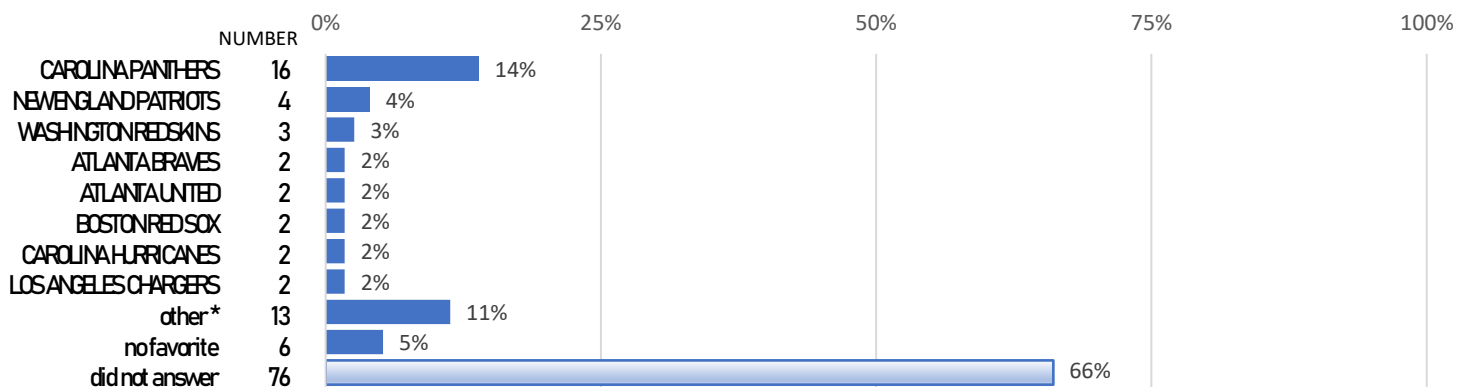


13. WHAT IS YOUR FAVORITE COLLEGE TEAM?
